A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

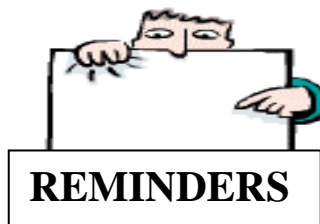

Like we've never loved before.

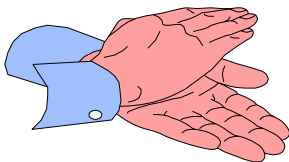
If we treat each other with respect,

- **Kum ich nisht heint, kum ich morgen**--If I don't come today, I'll come tomorrow (procrastinator's slogan)
- **Kumen tsu gast**--To visit
- **Kuntzen**--Tricks
- **Kunyehlemel**--Naïve, clumsy, awkward person; nincompoop; Casper Milquetoast
- **K'vatsh**--Boneless person, one lacking character; a whiner, weakling
- **K'velen**--Glow with pride and happiness, beam; be delighted
- **K'vetsh**--Whine, complain, whiner, a complainer
- **Landen**--Scholar, erudite person, learned man
